Nomination procedure	 EWP network: Digital nomination via the platform by the sending institution Or via email to: incomings@hochschule-bc.de Outside Europe: Nomination via email to incomings@hochschule-bc.de Necessary information: first name(s), last name(s), home faculty, e-mail address, start semester and duration of stay (1 or 2 semesters)
Application process	We will contact the students with further application instructions including the link to our online application portal and put the contact person from the sending institution in cc. Deadlines: Winter semester (Oct - Feb): May 15 th Summer semester (Mar - Jul): November 15 th
Selection of Courses	 English courses can be found in our <u>course overview</u> and our <u>lectures plan</u> German Beginners/Intermediate/Advanced Course (each 2 ECTS credits) + Intercultural Training for Incomings (1 ECTS credit) are mandatory and part of the Learning Agreement HBC offers 2 clusters of interdisciplinary English courses (30 ECTS for each cluster) for Incoming students. Health Insurance	Statutory health insurance is compulsory for all students in Germany. Students from the EU/EEA or Switzerland: Your national health insurance covers you during your stay in Germany. The only document you will need is your valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Students from Turkey will need to provide the A/T 11 certificate. Students from non-European countries: You must have a German statutory health insurance, which is to conclude before coming to Germany. It is valid from the beginning of the semester (1st of September/1st of March)/from the date of enrolment and the cost is approximately 140€ per month. Your national health insurance or a travel health insurance is not sufficient for enrolment at the university! In Biberach and the surrounding area you will find the following health insurance companies (please note that we cannot take responsibility for pages maintained by external providers): • AOK • Barmer • BKK VerbundPlus • DAK Gesundheit • Debeka BKK • Pronova BKK • Techniker Students ≥ 30 years of age from non-European countries: You must insure yourself with a German private health insurance. Private health insurances from abroad are not accepted. Further information is provided by the International Office.

We strongly recommend all incoming students to have a liability insurance for the duration of their stay in Germany, as all personal and property damages caused by negligence must Liability insurance be compensated according to German law. **Residence Permit:** Students who can enter Germany for 3 months without a visa are obliged to apply for residence permit during orientation program at HBC. The following documents are needed: Completed and signed residence permit application **Passport** Current biometric passport photo Proof of health insurance German tenancy agreement Certificate of enrolment HBC Proof of finances: scholarship/declaration of commitment/blocked account Visa: Students from non-EU countries who need a visa for entering Germany will obtain all necessary papers in time by HBC. For more information check the Visa-Navigator and visit the page of the German Academic Exchange Service. Visa/Residence Permit **Important:** All students from non-European countries need a proof of finances. The minimum amount of money to be proven is 992€ per month. It can be done in various ways (a combination of several sources is possible): Scholarship award notification Blocked account Official declaration of commitment at the German embassy by the parents or a legal guardian Please make sure to inquire at the German embassy in your home country which form of financial proof is required/accepted! If you decide to open a blocked account, you may use one of the following providers (please note that we cannot take responsibility for pages maintained by external providers): **Expatrio** Fintiba Coracle If you are from a country, in which the euro is not the standard currency, we recommend to open a German bank account before coming to Germany. ECTS and Grading System	ECTS: Stands for European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System Is a common European grading framework designed on the purpose of facilitating the academic exchange among EU countries Each ECTS credit generally requires around 30 hours of work. A standard full year of study workload is equivalent to 60 ECTS credits. German grading system: 1 – 1.5 Very good 1.6 – 2.5 Good 2.6 – 3.5 Satisfactory 3.6 – 4.0 Sufficient Below 4.0 Fail
